Re: Eligibility for Interscholastic Athletics, Inclusive Athletics and Extracurricular

Activities

Per the schooleopening guidance that the New York State Education Department (NED) issued earlier this month istricts have been afforded flexible scheduling options as they pland is to some cases the student, districts must make any planned school sponsored activities available to all students who encolled in the district and therwise qualified to participate. Districts may not exclude students from participating in any school sponsored activity solely on the basis of their instructional programurposes of this memo, "enrolled in the district" means those students who are reported in SIRS with a district of resident co and those included in the Average Daily Membership calculation in SAMS for state aid purposes.

If districts are conducting extracular activities, including sports, clubs, arts or sotaller students enrolled in the districtust be given fair and equal access to such activities for which they are otherwise qualified to participage of the choice of schedule whether made by the student or by the scholastoict schools and districts have the option whether or not to participate in interscholastic sports or provide extracurricular activities they deem appropriate. However, tuslents may not be restricted excluded from participating in any ctivities
