## **BOARD OF REGENTS NOVEMBER ITEMS**

**Certification**. The Department presented an overview of certification and <u>plans for a comprehensive review of certification</u> in response to teacher shortages across New York State. Based on feedback from the field, there are many certification regulations, policies, and procedures under review. Next steps in the review include: making certification changes driven by Board of Regents policy goals; investing in a supportive, responsive, and efficient certification process for applicants; continuing stakeholder engagement; reducing certification complexity to achieve policy goals while maintaining rigorous standards; and proposing regulatory changes to the Board of Regents at future meetings, as necessary.
